Dear Friends,

In 2022, the First Coast No More Homeless Pets team had a profound impact in our community as we continued to proudly serve pet-owning families and our rescue and shelter partners, as well as volunteer trappers and animal advocates who all rely on our safety net veterinary services and spay/neuter programs. With rising costs and effects of inflation, this year was an especially important time for us to remain available to the 67,000 clients that walked through our doors seeking our assistance for their furry friends – sometimes simply needing pet food to provide adequate nutrition for their devoted companions during a time of financial challenge.

As we celebrated our 20th anniversary and recognized the amount of compassionate care we were able to provide with your generous support of our many life-saving programs, your enthusiasm, trust, and continued commitment to our mission have fueled our desire to do more in the midst of finding ways to increase our capacity so that no pet is turned away, and no family is left without options to care for their beloved companions.

In 2022 we developed meaningful partnerships to ensure our services are protecting the vulnerable pets that are at risk of entering our shelter systems. One of these new partnerships has enabled our medical team to provide charitable veterinary care for senior citizens living on fixed incomes; this new collaboration with Aging True removes financial barriers so that ill or injured dogs and cats receive prompt medical intervention so they can recover and return to their loving homes. We know the human/pet bond is a powerful one and how much families cherish these special connections.

Our spay/neuter center provided care to 21,819 dogs and cats, preventing millions of unwanted litters, making us one of the largest spay/neuter centers in the nation again this year. Our Board of Directors and Leadership Team announced our exciting Leading The Way Capital Campaign and developed plans to improve and expand the Spay Neuter Center and Community Clinic. This substantial-- and much needed-- undertaking will have a positive effect on our ability to enhance and expand our level of patient care while creating more welcoming experiences for our clients, volunteers, staff, and most importantly, the dogs and cats we serve. We are now over halfway to our 2 million dollar goal!

I hope these next few pages touch your heart as you read the stories of the precious pets we have been able to provide healthy outcomes for, thanks to your caring and giving spirit. The future is bright for the animals in our community as we work together to strengthen our dedication to expanding access to care for all those who call upon us in the years ahead.

- Expanding parking for clients and staff with upgraded outdoor safety features
- Updating equipment for better sanitation, diagnoses, and service
- Increasing opportunities for training programs, including our partnership with the UF College of Veterinary Medicine

We have developed exciting plans that promise to vastly improve the Norwood Clinic's ability to meet the needs of owners, pets, and our dedicated staff. We believe that due to these upgrades, the entire experience will be positively transformed for all.

When Gabriel brought his cat, Man, into our Cassat location, he was having trouble walking, eating, drinking, and was exhibiting other signs of distress. As our doctors did a complete evaluation, our client care team came to understand how important Man was to Gabriel. Earlier that day, he received a call at work that a fire had destroyed his home. He shared with us that when he pulled up to the scene, Man jumped into his arms and they held tight to one another as he surveyed the damage.

Our doctors were able to fix Man up, and our Angel Fund was used to offset the cost of the care. As Man left the hospital, our team once again realized how important their work is- far beyond just caring for sick animals.



Skadi had a rough time as a puppy; over the first few years of her life, she was confined to a small space and neighbors became increasingly more concerned about her. They were able to get her to a local shelter where she was made available for adoption. Sabrina had not had the best couple of years either and was feeling lost, until she adopted Skadi.

"Skadi immediately brightened my existence. I have learned so much from this amazing animal...She is the biggest blessing to come into my life."

Sabrina almost lost Skadi when a dogfight broke out and Skadi suffered serious wounds. Thanks to the generous support of the Angel Fund, our doctors were able to patch up Skadi without adding overwhelming financial pressure to Sabrina's tight budget.

Andrew found Lucky in his mechanic shop when he was so young his eyes hadn't even opened yet! After watching him grow up as part of the family, Andrew became concerned when Lucky developed a blockage.

"Luck"ily, our team got him the care he needed (including emergency surgery!) at a cost Andrew could afford.

Lucky is happy, healthy, and back at home, where he greets Andrew at the door every day after work!

VTEEP VET TECH EDUCATION & EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

Designed to educate, support, and employ residents from targeted low-income zip codes across the Northeast Florida region.

The program focuses on the early entry workforce program and provides unique access to STEM-based comprehensive vocational training in the fast-growing veterinary medicine sector. Since launching this program in August of 2019, we have served 11 young women and 3 young men.

JASMINE




Jasmine loves helping people and animals, and found that being a veterinary tech allowed her to do both!




